

# Welcometo the library!



The library is open to everyone.

The library has books available in different languages for both children and adults. Here you will find newspapers, periodicals, language courses, community information, music, computers and more.

It does not cost anything to borrow books from the library.

## Get a library card

You need a library card to borrow materials or access computers. The library card is free of charge at all the libraries in the municipality of Karlskrona. In order to obtain a library card, you must provide identification and sign an application form agreeing to our terms and conditions:

- You are responsible for all materials borrowed on your card.
- If you are a parent, you are responsible for what your children borrow.
- If you return materials that are overdue, you have to pay an overdue fine per day.
- If materials are damaged or lost, you will have to pay the cost of replacement.

If you lose your library card you must notify the library immediately. If you want a replacement card, it costs 20 SEK if you are 18 or over, and 10 SEK if you are under 18.

If you wish to use our automated system to borrow books, reserve computers or borrow e-books, you will need a pin code that you choose yourself. Ask the staff for assistance.

The borrowing period is normally four weeks, but it might be shorter - check your receipt! You may return what you have borrowed at whatever library you wish in the municipality of Karlskrona.
